I must :

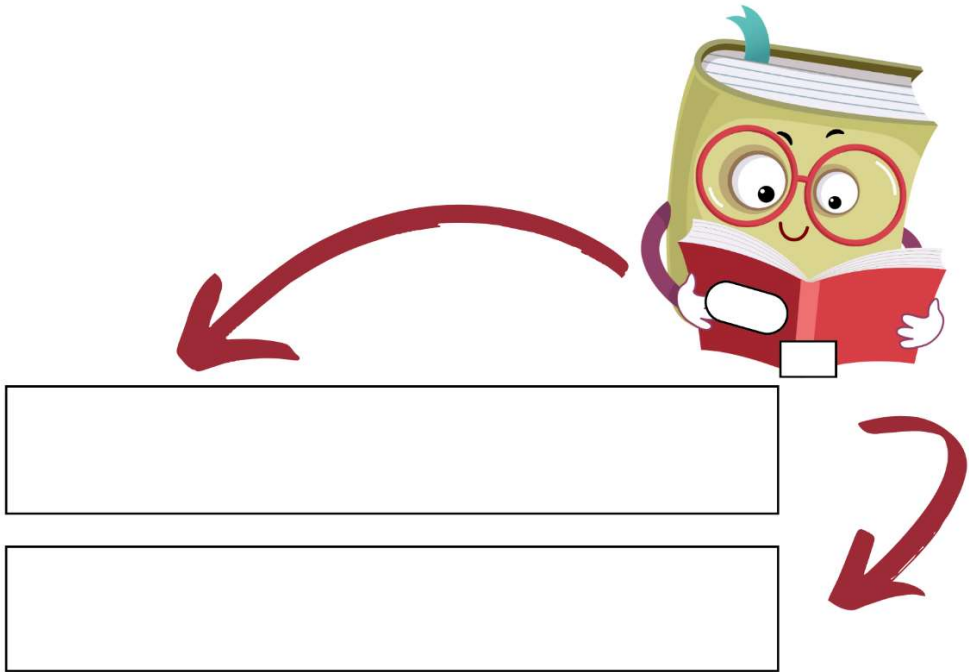
- come quietly
